OUR CO-OP STRUCTURE: As a co-op, we utilize the talents, experience, and financial contributions of our families, coupled with paid, professional staff to ensure the smooth operation of the co-op and to enhance each family's experience. In this model, the co-op becomes the families' school as much as it is the child's school. Families work in it, give energy and ideas to its operation and, ultimately, help shape the success of the co-op. In return, families gain a sense of ownership and community in the co-op, participate in additional educational opportunities around parenting, make deep and lasting friendships and model life-long service and communication skills in a shared setting with their children.

2024 - 2025 Program & Class Offerings

Infant/Toddler Program & Classes:

Our Infant/Toddler program provides classes for families and their children from 6 weeks to 23 months. Classes introduce children to peer interaction, child-led exploration and problem solving; with many classes incorporating parent education and support for families. For more information about our programs or to discuss your child's individual needs, please contact our Preschool Director.

Infant Community Group

This program is designed to build community amongst parents and families who have welcomed a new child who is 6 weeks to 11 months old. Here families will be given opportunities to share their experiences, ask for support, and begin friendships with other parents and children. Prior to the class, the facilitator will set up a developmentally appropriate environment for all infants to explore. The facilitator will then welcome families at the beginning of the session and then give the participants space to build community. At the end the facilitator will return to lead a closing with families at the end and be available for child development guidance based on the ages and stages of the class. Children who are 11 months or older are encouraged to join the parent child class as they have aged out of this class.

- Days: Wednesdays 11:30am 12:30pm
- Ages: Infants 6 weeks to 11 months and their parent
- Class size: Up to 12 children with one facilitator
- Tuition: FREE, must sign up for one month at a time
- One-time Registration & Materials Fee: \$20 (per child)
- Annual One-time Membership Fee: \$25 (per family)

Parent & Child for Infant/Toddlers:

This class is geared to expose children to social interaction and problem-solving, hands-on art and sensory activities, music/movement, and circle time.

- Days: Wednesdays 9:15am 10:45am
- Ages: For children 12 to 23 months old
- Class size: Up to 12 children (and an accompanying adult) and one teacher
- Tuition: Levels 1, 2, & 3: \$100 per month, Level 4: \$80 per month
- Application fee: \$25
- Annual non-refundable Membership fee: \$25 (per family)
- One-time Registration & Materials fee: \$75 (per child)

Member Family Requirements

 Parent/Child families are welcome to join any general meetings, but attendance as a non-participating member is not required.

Toddler Transition:

Our Toddler Transition class revolves around experiential learning and introduction to real-life events and understandings. The curriculum infuses learning into daily activities and routines; all while nurturing self-awareness, expressive language, problem-solving, and self-advocacy. Children will participate in circle time, art, sensory, snack, dramatic play, and movement--all in an organized environment prepared for the unique needs of the group. This drop-off program scaffolds children's and parent's transition into preschool. Potty training is not required.

- Days: Tuesdays and Thursdays 9:15am 11:15am
- Ages: For children ages 24 months (by September 1) to 35 months
- Class size: Up to 15 children with 1 teacher and up to 2 parent-assistants
- Tuition:
 - Level 4: \$230/month
 - o Level 3: \$285/month
 - Level 2: \$345/month
 - o Level 1: \$415/month
- Application fee: \$25 for returning families, \$75 for 1st child of new families (\$25 each additional child)
- One-time Registration & Materials Fee: \$150 (per child)
- One-time Membership fee: \$25 (per family)

Member Family Requirements

- Classroom assisting per level selected
- Serve on one or more school teams per level selected
- Attend Co-op Welcome Orientation (August), Annual Business Meeting (May)
- Attend Trimester and/or class-specific meetings or responsibilities
- Work one Saturday for a facility maintenance and cleaning day

Preschool Program:

Our preschool program offers classes that provide a wide-range of developmental and cognitive opportunities with two overarching themes—social communication and problem-solving. While the children have ongoing opportunities for art, dramatic play, sensory and outdoor activities, handwriting, movement, and math experiences, we facilitate cooperation, pro-social interactions, and enable (through emotional, physical, and verbal support) interactive problem-solving amongst children. 3-day Preschool:

Our preschool classes directly reflect the interests and abilities expressed by the children while incorporating foundational concepts through play, socialization, and language. Each day consists of a consistent rhythm that provides circle time, story time, snack, indoor/outdoor format, classroom socializing and play--but no two days are the same! Children are required to be potty-trained.

- Days: Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday 9:00am-12:00pm
- Ages: For children ages 3 years (by September 1st) through 5 years
- Class size: Up to 25 children with 2 teachers and up to 3 parent-assistants
- Tuition:

Enrichment Programs and Classes:

Our enrichment program provides varied opportunities for children to experience the benefits of play and child-centered learning beyond the school day. Classes are geared toward preschool through early elementary age children and are offered on a trimester basis. For more information about our programs or to discuss your child's individual needs, please contact our Preschool Director.

Explorers only

Our extended day program provides project based opportunities for children to experience the benefits of play and child-centered learning beyond the school day. Children will bring their own lunch to enjoy before working in a small group on focused learning opportunities. Classes are geared toward older preschoolers through early elementary age children and are offered on a trimester basis.

- Days: Tuesday and Thursdays 12:00pm 2:15pm
- Ages: For preschool-aged children 4 5 years old and/or those currently enrolled in TK/Kindergarten
- Class size: Up to 8 children with one teacher and one parent-assistant
- Tuition: \$190/mo (must enroll for a trimester at time)
- One-time Registration & Materials Fee: \$20 (per child)
- Annual One-time Membership Fee: \$25 (per family)

Preschool plus Explorers

Explorers is for children who will be enrolled in both the Preschool class and the Explorers enrichment class leading to an extended pre-school day. Enrolling in both for the same child allows for families to save on tuition - a 15% discount!

- Days: Tuesday and Thursdays 12:00pm 2:15pm (children will stay after preschool class has finished on Tuesday and Thursday)
- Ages: For preschool-aged children 4 through 5 years old
- Class size: Up to 8 children with one teacher and one parent-assistant
- Tuition: Cost includes both Preschool class and Explorers enrichment day class (including a 15% discount)

PlayON:

Play ON is our Outdoor Nature program and is for children to explore the wonder and fun of nature. We will facilitate hikes, games, nature activities/discussion, and encourage exploration of and play in the great outdoors. Each class also includes activities and a gathering time where we may sing songs, enjoy a story, and share or document our experiences. Class locations are held at various outdoor locations (rain or shine!) within about a 15-minute drive of the co-op location.

- Days: Mondays 9:30 am 11:00 am
- Ages:
 - Parent Child: 2.5 5 years old (with a grown-up) (Siblings under 2.5 may come, but must be worn by the grown-up) OR
 - o Drop off: For children ages 3.5 8 years old
- Class size:
 - Parent Child: Up to 12 Children (and their one adult) and 1 teacher
 - Drop Off: Up to 8 Children with 1 teacher and 1 parent assistant
- Open to: Participating Members & Non-Participating Members
- Tuition:

 - \$70/ 4 week session with \$5 materials fee
 - \$100/ 6 week session with \$5 materials fee
 - Drop Off:

Pop-up Enrichment

Our enrichment program provides varied opportunities for children to experience the benefits of play and child-centered learning beyond the school day. Children will bring and enjoy their lunch with their peers. Classes are geared toward preschool through early elementary age children and are offered on a trimester basis. Topics may include: art, science, sensory, etc.

- **Days:** Pop Up Event on Mondays or Fridays depending on teacher availability. Approx 1 time per month for 1.5 hours.
- Ages: For preschool-aged children 3 through 8 years old
- Class size: Up to 10 children with one teacher and one parent-assistant
- Tuition: \$20/day
- Annual One-time Membership Fee: \$25 (per family)

ABOUT BRIGHT BEGINNINGS:

Bright Beginnings Folsom is a non-profit cooperative organization offering programs and classes for families with young children. To participate in any of our classes or program offerings, membership is required.

We offer a range of membership options for the same low annual membership fee. Our goal is to provide you with access to our programs and classes and still provide your family with flexibility in co-op participation.

HOW THE CO-OP WORKS:

Families have the opportunity to be involved in a variety of ways that enable them to share in the operation and direction of the organization at a level that fits with their family circumstances. Combining the collective talents and contributions support the quality programs and classes we offer and sustain the operations of the co-op.

CO-OP MEMBERSHIP

We offer two types of annual membership – **Participating** and **Non-Participating** based on the program(s) enrolled.

Non-Participating Membership

Non-Participating Member Families are non-voting members of the organization who gain access to eligible classes and program offerings and have minimal participation requirements. They have minimal requirements, but still have access to Parent Education resources, special events and access to priority enrollment. Those enrolled ONLY in the Parent/Child or an Enrichment program are considered non-participating members. If a Member has a second child enrolled and is enrolled in the Toddler or Preschool program, they are then considered a Participating Member of the Co-op.

WHICH PARTICIPATING MEMBERSHIP LEVEL IS RIGHT FOR ME?

Level 4 membership is for families that are interested in the highest level of commitment to the Co-op and are able to commit to significantly impactful roles such as serving on at least two teams or serving on the Board of Directors.. Classroom assistance will be 1-2 times a month (if more is needed based upon enrollment, this group will be asked to work in the classroom more.) A limited number of Level 4 memberships are offered.

Level 3 membership is the most common membership level as it balances classroom commitment and co-op commitment. It is for families that are able to work in the classroom 3-5 times per month and serve on one team.

Level 2 membership is for families that want to be a part of the Co-Op, including serving on one team, but are only able to work in the classroom 1-2 times per month. A limited number of Level 2 memberships are offered.

Level 1 membership is for families that want to be a part of the Co-op, including serving on one team, but are unable to work in the classroom. *A limited number of Level 1 memberships are offered.*

At the time of application, families will be asked to state their preferred membership levels. Membership levels are offered to families based on priority factors (e.g., returning family, application processing date, etc). Levels are offered based on enrollment and co-op needs.

Membership Dues: \$25 per family annually, non-refundable

These dues cover liability and student accident insurance, affiliate memberships to SVC/CCPPNS dues, and other technology fees. "Membership fees do not cover class or program tuition, nor do they include member benefits such as access to parent education resources, newsletters, events, etc."

Priority/Timing for Enrollment:

- 1. Priority enrollment is based on the following factors:
 - a. Membership selection: Type and Level, including commitment to serving on the Board of Directors
 - b. Returning family, with number of years of Co-op enrollment considered
 - c. Family alignment with program goals and mission
- 2. Priority enrollment factors are taken into consideration when applications will be processed in batches after the following dates:
 - a. 2/26/24 3/8/24: Priority enrollment for current families
 - b. 3/11/24 3/31/24 : Open to all
 - c. 4/1/24 4/30/24 : Open to all
 - d. 5/1/24 5/31/24 : Open to all
 - e. 6/1/24 6/30/24 : Open to all
 - f. All applications received after 7/1 will be processed on a first come first serve basis
- 3. Offers will be given within 2 4 weeks of the batch date listed above.
- 4. If a preferred membership level or class cannot be offered at the time of your application, you will be placed on a waitlist for your highest preferred level and/or class. If and when a spot becomes available, you will be notified.
